July Demonstration – Marion Chapman

Marion Chapman demonstrated contemporary still life at our June meeting, utilising a series of pre-prepared drafts to illustrate the watercolour techniques and stages.

Colours for the butterflies theme reflected personal choice and mood, and techniques shown included poured watercolour,



and using masking fluid with an applicator.

Marion used Saunders Waterford 300 gsm paper and Daniel Smith masking fluid.

Glenda shared her techniques and a philosophy on abstract painting: 'Don't plan – just do!'

She demonstrated a total abstract, using masks and varied edges. Examples of paper were Arches Aquarelle hot-pressed watercolour paper and Canson's large oil painting sheets.
